Our guest speaker, Vic Vickroy, and our President Susie Haszelbart gave a great presentation of carriage whip history, of where originated, why they were made out of specific materials, how long they should be, how to store them, who fixes them when they break, where to buy them, the rules of whips on the carriage, and how to use one.

There was a variety of whips to examine and to practice with; we knocked the cups off the tables. We also had the opportunity to handle Susie's beautiful holly whip and learn about what the bumps are good for. It was a very interesting presentation.

You can drive any size horse or pony, from miniature to draft, or drive a mule, donkey or burro.

Put that lawn ornament or out-grown pony to work! Put those poor tired hips and knees of yours on a carriage seat instead of straddling a saddle!

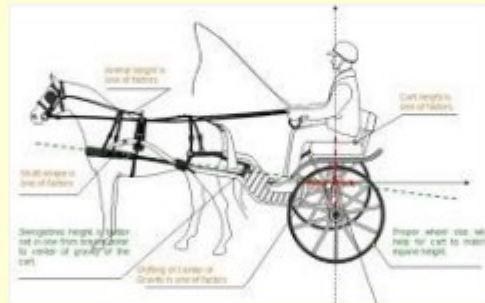
Just as with any other equestrian discipline, it can take time to become proficient, but this clinic can get you started.

The intent of our Annual Easter Egg Hunt is to have fun, to offer an opportunity for fellow enthusiasts to visit, and to offer a safe environment for our equine partners to refresh themselves after the winter doldrums. Everyone is welcome to join CDS and enjoy the fun!!

How it works:

- Arrive at 10 am or before to decorate your carriage and/or horse/pony/mini/mule/burro/children
- Secure your horse.
- Sign in (& pay your \$25 club dues, if you haven't already.)
- Get your number tags.
- Tie one tag to your cart and one to your basket. (or to yourself if you're ground-driving, in which case an apron with a pocket for eggs may be helpful.)

11 am Potluck Brunch

- Bring your potluck food to the pavilion
- Bring your own plates, utensils and drinks.
- Join the brunch and socialize!

1:00 Parade

- Drive your turnout into the arena for the judges.
- Then proceed directly to the starting line (row of cones)

1:15 THE EASTER EGG HUNT!

- Line up at the starting line (row of cones)
- Set down your basket by a cone.



When the whistle blows:

1. Drive out into the field to find an egg. **STOP.**
 2. One helper gets down, picks up one egg, and gets back into the carriage.
 3. Drive back to your basket at the starting line. **STOP.**
 4. One helper gets down, puts the egg in the basket, & gets back into the carriage.
- REPEAT steps 1 thru 4 for each egg.
 - After 40 minutes or so, the judge will announce that you may pick up as many eggs as you want.

When the whistle blows again:

- Hand in your basket full of eggs at the Pavilion
- Secure your horse and come to the Pavilion.

2:30 Awards

- Come to the Pavilion for presentation of prizes!
- After the awards are given out, hard boiled eggs may be exchanged for candy-filled plastic eggs.
 - Help clean up & thank the organizers and judges.



This is the perfect first drive of the season to remind your horses how to **STOP, STAND, and GO!**

PRIZES

- Best Turnout (whatever that means)
- Best Bonnet or Hat
- Best Egg Finder
- Locaters of 'Special Eggs'



RULES

- Entries may be any safe cart or carriage hitched to any size equine. No horse? Line driving is also ok.
- An equine must have a bridle with reins attached and passed through the turrets before it is hitched to a carriage.
- Helpers must mount and dismount only from STOPPED carriages and carts.
- Only one helper from your turnout on the ground at a time
- Walk or trot only, no cantering.
- Judges are here for fun and to help keep us safe. They are volunteers and their word is final. Please thank them.
- Drivers please keep your helpers out of harm's way.
 - An unruly driver or equine will be invited off the field.



EGGS! Please bring eggs!

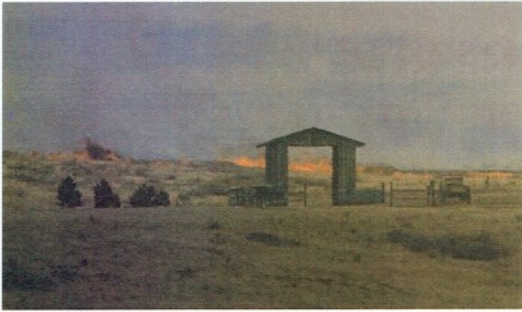
The more eggs we have to hide the more fun we all will have finding them!

HOW IT WORKS:

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter horses of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

RULES:

Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only
- Open division: any gait

Classes refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter:

- VSE (very small equine) under 9.3 hands—39"
- Small Pony—not to exceed 12.2 hands—50"
- Large Pony—over 12.2 hands—50", not over 14.2 hands—58"
- Horse—Over 14.2 hands—58"

Presentation

- Horses and riders must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style

Navigation

- All entries except single VSE and single Small Pony are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years or older with the exception of VSE.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive single in VSE class.
- Drivers over age 18 must be accompanied by a navigator 14 years of over with the exception of VSE.

Equipment

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required, but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake, and whip.
- A whip of suitable size to reach all horses must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so the groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be restored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost

COURSE:

- Course plans will be emailed after the closing date.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones/Obstacles will be set at a common width of 175 cm
- Hazards will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart
- The entry to each obstacle or gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag to indicate the correct direction. Entering an obstacle with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving hazard gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Hazard gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

SCORING:

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.

The Oklahoma Harness Horse Association welcomes Frank Luetz for a spring driving clinic. Frank has competed at the advanced level internationally with singles, pairs and four-in-hand turnouts. He has expertise in starting young horses and providing instruction to novice and experienced drivers.

Lessons will be held on the afternoon of Friday, April 20th, and from 8 -5 pm on Saturday and Sunday, April 21st and 22nd. Lessons are open to the public, with preference given to OHHA members for initial scheduling. OHHA members may audit the lessons for no charge. Lunch will be provided on Saturday and Sunday for participants for no additional charge. Lessons will be held in a 40x80 meter grass outdoor arena, or, in case of rain, a smaller indoor arena.

Overnight stalls will be available on a first come assignment basis. You must bring your own shavings and clean the stall before leaving the ranch.

Costs: \$125 for a 50 minute private lesson
\$300 for three 50 minute lessons with the same turnout

You recently received an email with attached log sheets for tracking your driving hours. Whether you're just getting your horse going on the ground (ground driving, or long lining,) or you are "Driving on the Box," (in a cart, carriage or wagon,) log your hours.

[Print your log sheet and start logging your driving hours.](#) The sheets are provided again below.

Each time you drive, just write the date and the amount of time you spend. Log your driving time from until November 2018, and turn in your completed log sheet.

Each driver that submits a log will receive a small medallion with your name, your horse's name, & hours accomplished.

Reminders for Event Organizers:

- 1. Guidelines for organizers, a sample budget, and reimbursement forms are available on the CDS web site. They're on the right hand side in the "Documents" section below the newsletters.
- 2. Three months before your event, submit a budget to the CDS event coordinator pat.lamprey@gmail.com. No publicity for an event will be released until your budget has been approved.
- 3. Once your budget is approved, please submit a description of the event to the newsletter editor.* Include event title, date, time, location, rain date, fees, organizer, details of the event, closing date for entries & where to send fee & registration. (Please send content with minimal formatting. We'll take care of the layout.)

- 4. For help recruiting volunteers, contact the volunteer coordinator* with a list of the positions to be filled (set-up, scribe, timer etc.) two months prior to the event
- 5. After your event, please send results, photos and a report to the newsletter editor.*
- 6. To be reimbursed by the club for an expense you incur, you must provide a receipt and a CDS reimbursement form, available on the CDS website.

Items that are donated require a receipt for the value of the item and the word "Donated" written on the receipt for tax purposes. This can include a judge's fee if the judge normally charges but chooses to donate the service to CDS.

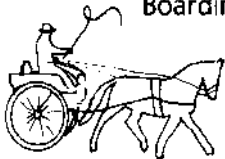

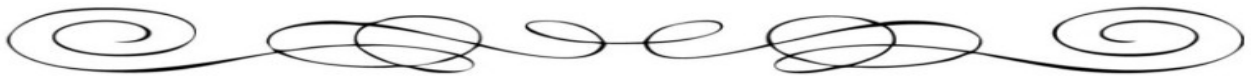
