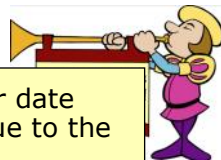

President's Message

Hello all,

CDS is marking the unofficial beginning of summer by helping members stay safe & drive during the Pandemic with plans for some socially-distanced events. Social distancing is a challenge when it comes to carriage driving however. The Federation Equestrian International (F.E.I.) has instituted their "Rules of Safe Practice", but there is still a grey area when it comes to carriage driving as it's impossible to maintain 6 feet between whips and their grooms. ADS is working to clarify these rules as it pertains to our sport.

As we shift from the "Stay At Home" order to the State's "Safer At Home" phase, CDS in person meetings remain cancelled, with an online Board Meeting planned for Thursday, June 11 at 6:00pm through the Zoom App. April's Zoom meeting went well, but several people were unable to join, their requests to join only showed up after the meeting concluded. We are working out the kinks, and will again send out details such as meeting ID and password via email a few days before the meeting.

Several activities have been relocated, rescheduled or cancelled for this year. The Driving 101 clinic has been moved to Sandy Clayton's farm, since the Franktown Firehouse has cancelled all meeting room use for the foreseeable future. The fate of the Long Lining Clinic will be decided by those attending Driving 101. The pleasure drive through Bannockburn is cancelled. We still hope to reschedule the Sporting Day of Traditional Driving and the first Driving Derby. The CDS Fun Day on June 13 at Salisbury is still up in the air as Salisbury has cancelled events through June 6. The Twenty Mile House Horse Driving Trial is still up in the air because of the

uncertainty about Salisbury Park. If we can use the park, it may be converted to a Fun Day of practice cones and marathon obstacles. The Navigator's Clinic has been rescheduled and relocated (see list of events).

At this point, the Colorado CDE and CT is still scheduled for September 25-27 at the Colorado Horse Park. Chairman Erik Jensen is in touch with officials from F.E.I., ADS & other CDE planners from around the country to figure out the feasibility of holding that event. A final decision on whether or not to go forward with it will be forthcoming shortly.

Regulating Your Horse's Pace

REGULATE the pace by the distance that you have to go, and, whatever the distance, keep going at a steady pace — from seven to nine miles an hour is a good average — and it is a great mistake in long driving to go sometimes very fast and then try to balance it by going very slowly. In the old coaching days, when long distances were covered and the horses had to be kept in good condition, the general principle was to keep the horses going at about the same gait uphill and down, and this applies quite as much with a pair or a single horse. It is easier for a horse, and tires him less, to keep a steady gait than to walk up and down hill and then go very fast on the flat.

The most important thing about driving horses, especially for distance driving, is to find by experience their natural fast gait and then to keep them to it, and never to urge your horses beyond their natural gait, as nothing tires them so quickly. On the other hand, it tires a high-spirited horse almost as much to keep holding him back from his natural gait. Horses, after they have been driven a bit, know better than their drivers how to cover the ground, and they generally had much better be left to pick out their own gait than be forced to what the driver thinks is the gait they should take. So, in going up or down hill, if a horse shows a natural inclination to trot up even a steep hill, let him trot if he wants to; it will tire him less than holding him back.

It is also a great mistake, which many drivers make, to walk horses down every hill they come to. Unless a hill is very steep, it is far easier to keep up a steady even trot, and if you have a heavy trap and find it straining your horse, drive him in the soft part of the road, which will hold back the trap. In going up or down very steep hills, it is easier for the horses to zigzag from side to side, though of course at a walk, as a hill as steep as that cannot be undertaken at a trot.

. . .

When you come to a hill, remember that your horses in going up need to stretch their heads out in order to exert their full strength. You should, therefore, give them their heads as much as they want, provided always that you keep them in hand. In going downhill, on the other hand, the horses should always be reined in, though, as I have said, not enough to bring them down to a walk unless the hill is very steep; they should, however, be kept well in hand in going down as there is then the greatest danger of stumbling.

Carriage driving is more than just a big draft horse pulling a bunch of sightseers around town. Carriage driving is one of the fastest growing equestrian sports today, and can be as difficult or simple as you choose to make it: a simple picnic drive with friends, a trail "ride" through a park, an exhilarating cross-country marathon, a challenging obstacle course, a dressage test as sophisticated as the highest level of ridden dressage.

You can drive any size horse or pony, from miniature to draft, or drive a mule or donkey instead. Put that lawn ornament or out-grown pony to work! Have an older horse that needs a different exercise program? Put those dreams of yours on a carriage seat instead of a saddle! You and your horse can learn new ways to enjoy this equine sport.

Just as with any other equestrian discipline, it can take years to become a really successful carriage driver, but this clinic can get you started.

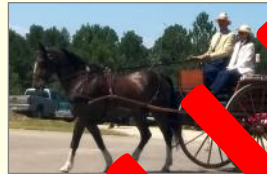

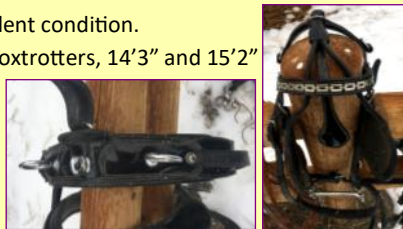

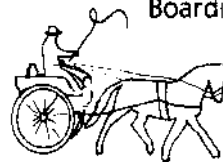
