Greetings,

What a wonderful month of driving in Colorado. May 12 was a unique opportunity to enjoy the Colorado Horse Park. We were able to practice our dressage tests, drive a challenging cones course, and play in the water & tree hazards. Pat Lamprey led a large group of volunteers through the parts & pieces of a Combined Driving Event. Thank you to everyone who participated as volunteers & drivers.

With the steady rains, our Sporting Day of Traditional Driving was moved to Sunday, May 20th. We all appreciated the generous hospitality of Erik & Mary Jensen for hosting this spectacular event. They create an ambience to celebrate & preserve the driving traditions. This year, Kail Palmer-Miller from Pennsylvania, was our judge. She was very helpful in her review of all our turnouts, and gave specific suggestions of how we could improve.

We had great fun with all 3 phases of this day ... Turnout Inspection, Country Drive and Cones Course. The Turnout Inspection was situated in the picturesque Jensen's courtyard. Next was the hour & 1/2 pleasure drive through the scenic country roads in Franktown, including 3 driving tests. The Hub/Pub test awarded points for the right front hub lined up with the cone, as we came in at a trot and then we were asked to demonstrating proper whip signal for a right & left turn & stop. We were offered a ice cold beer or water at this location. At the Champagne stop, we stopped our turnout between the fore & aft cones and were awarded points for our horses standing quiet for 3 minutes, while we enjoyed a glass of champagne, then we backing our horses. The Serpentine was the last test were we looped through 4 cones in serpentine pattern, then executed an Achenbach circle, and finished with another 4 serpentine loops. The final phase was the 14 pair of cones with balls atop, where we had 2 minutes to complete the course.

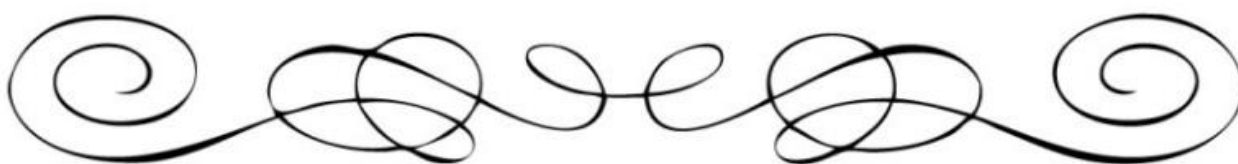

How it works:

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter horses of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

RULES

Divisions

- Training Level Division: no cantering.
- Open division: any gait.

Classes entries refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter, including mules and donkeys:

- VSE/under 9.3 hands (39 inches) (VSE=very small equine)
- Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands)
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

Presentation:

- Horses and riders must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style.

Navigators:

- All entries except VSE or small pony are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry and must be at least 14 years old .
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE or small pony.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive single in VSE class.

Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be restored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

Course:

- A course diagram will be emailed after the closing date and will be available upon check-in.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones will be set at a width of 200 centimeters.
- Obstacle gates will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart.
- The entry to each gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction. Entering a gate with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

SCORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time. Penalties are listed on the page after the entry form.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.
- There will be recognition for the lowest combined scores from Derby I on June 16 and Derby II on Sept 15, 2018.

To Enter the Driving Derby.

- Fill out the entry form on the next page.
- Entries and fees must be received no later than May 26, 2018. *Make checks payable to Colorado Driving Society.* A confirmation email will be sent upon receipt of entry.
- If you are under 18, your parent or legal guardian must sign the release on the entry form along with you.
- Drivers and navigators (and parent/guardian when applicable) must sign release on entry form before participating.

It is intended primarily for Training or Preliminary Level drivers, but Intermediate Level drivers are welcome as well. We start with a dressage test, then a cones course, followed after lunch by a cross country marathon course with three or four obstacles to negotiate along the way.

DIVISIONS AND CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

TRAINING DIVISION:

Recommended for competitors beginning combined driving competition. It is an introduction to the sport for horse and driver. The tests acquaint competitors with the basic gaits, figures, and obstacles that are the foundation of all combined driving events.

Dressage:

Entries will drive ADS Training Level Dressage Test 4 POM*

Cones: Cones speeds: Horses & ponies 180 mpm; VSE 160 mpm. No cantering

Marathon: The marathon will consist of no more than 4 obstacles with up to 3 gates each. Obstacles will not be timed individually, but time in the obstacles will count towards the total marathon time. Marathon speeds: Horses 13 kph; Ponies 12 kph; Small Ponies 11 kph; VSE 9 kph. No cantering.

PRELIMINARY DIVISION:

Recommended for horses and drivers with some prior competition experience and who would like to further their training experience and training program. The tests encourage development of basic gaits, obedience, suppleness and balance.

Dressage:

Entries will drive ADS Preliminary Level Dressage Test 4 POM*

Cones speeds: Horses & Ponies 200 mpm; VSE 180 mpm.

Marathon: The marathon will consist of up to 4 timed obstacles with up to 4 gates. Marathon speeds: Horses 14 kph; Ponies 13 kph; Small Ponies 12 kph; VSE 9 kph.

INTERMEDIATE DIVISION:

Recommended for horses and drivers with more experience looking for an additional low stress competition. Intermediate entries will use the same marathon course as Preliminary Level drivers.

Dressage:

Entries will drive ADS Intermediate Level Dressage Test 4.*

Cones speeds: Horses & Ponies 220 mpm; VSE 190 mpm

Marathon: The marathon will consist of up to 4 timed obstacles with up to 4 gates. Marathon speeds: Horses 14 kph; Ponies 13 kph; Small Ponies 12 kph; VSE 9 kph.

GENERAL RULES

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SUBMITTING ENTRIES.

1. **A bridle with reins attached and passed through the saddle terrets must be in place when ever a horse is put to a vehicle.** Failure to comply will incur elimination.
2. The 20 Mile House Combined Driving Trial will be conducted and judged according to American Driving Society rules insofar as possible.
3. Neither the management of the event, the Organizing Committee, the Show Committee, nor the property owners of any property used during the event accept any responsibility for accidents, damage, injury or illness to the horses, owners, riders, driver, employees, attendants, spectators or any other person or property in connection with this competition.
4. **HARNESS AND VEHICLES MUST BE IN GOOD CONDITION, SAFE, uniform in appearance, and of an accepted style.** Vehicles may have iron or solid rubber tires. Pneumatic tires will be allowed at all levels for Very Small Equines. Pneumatic tires will be allowed for horse and pony vehicles in Training Level only. Vehicles, harnesses or equipment that are found to be unsafe will not be allowed to compete or remain in use during the event.
5. **ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH AT ALL TIMES! (Better yet, leave them home!)**
6. ADS veterinary and cruelty rules will be observed. If during the show an animal is deemed unfit to continue, this decision, under the aegis of the judge, will be final.
7. Junior drivers under 14 years of age, except those driving VSE/miniature horses, must be accompanied in the carriage by a knowledgeable adult horseperson. Failure to comply will incur elimination.
8. **A groom/navigator is required for all turn-outs on the marathon, except for VSE competitors aged 14 or older.** Additional passengers are permitted. **Groom/navigators must be at least 14 years of age.**
9. Breeching and/or brakes are required for the marathon.
10. **HARD HATS are required for the cones and marathon.**
11. Groom/navigators may ride more than once if scheduling

Volunteers receive thorough instructions in advance.

On show day, we're happy to have you for all or just part of the day. Either way, **we'll feed you—and thank you!**

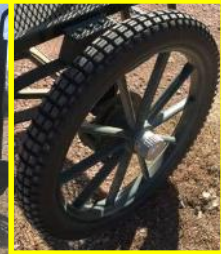

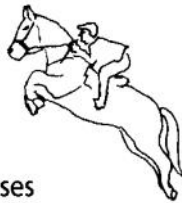

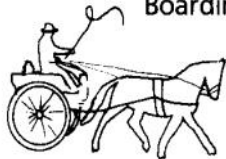
