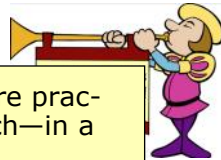

We're still looking for people to fill two critical positions:

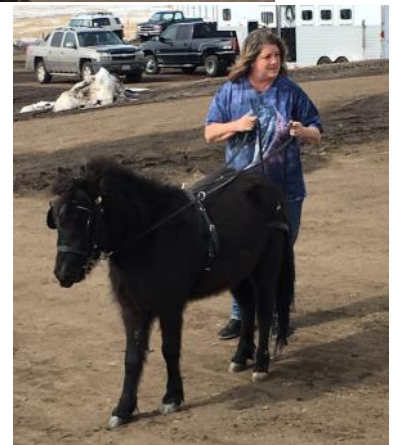
- **Newsletter Editor**—Collects information, formats it in MS Publisher (help available!), and distributes it through the CDS email distribution list.

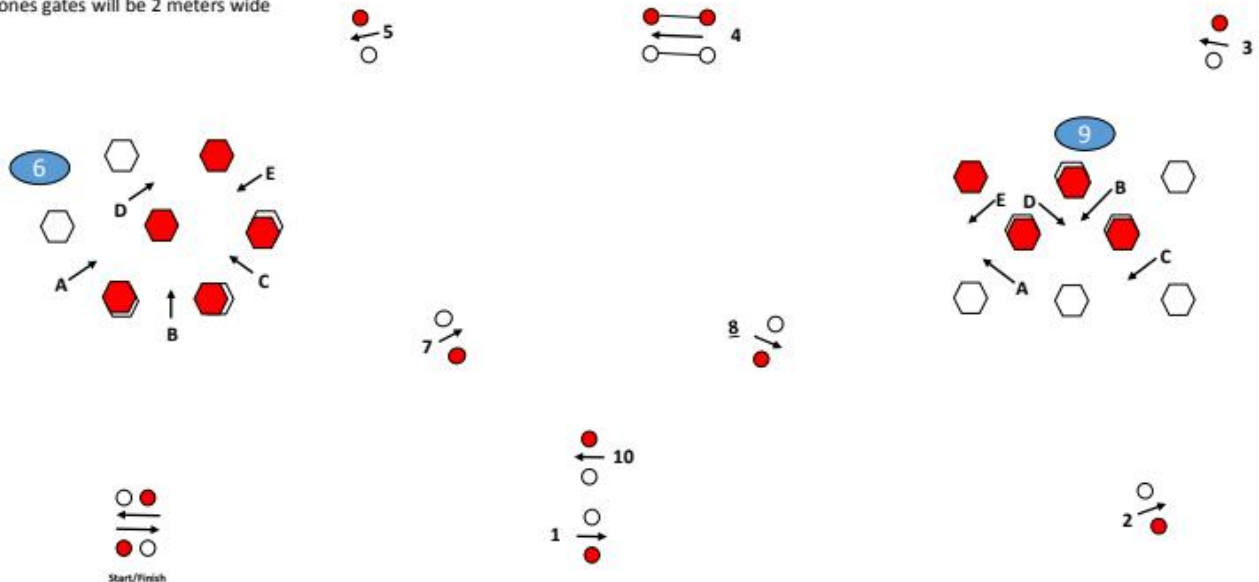

The American Driving Society, Inc. Announces Pony and VSE Measurement Program

Cross Plains, WI.-The American Driving Society, Inc. (ADS) announced for 2020 its new Pony & VSE Measurement Program. Appendix GR-B and Article 930.4 will be added to the 2020 ADS Rulebook:

1. ADS Ponies are 120cm to 148cm with or without shoes, 149 with shoes.
2. ADS Small Ponies are 99cm to less than 120cm; with or without shoes.
3. VSEs are under 99cm with or without shoes.
4. Animals will be measured prior to their first competition of each year until reaching the competition age of 8 years, after which they will receive a Permanent Card.
5. Measurement Cards are for the exclusive use of ADS Competitions.

Measurement Procedures:

- An ADS Measurement may be taken by only a trained ADS Licensed Official, a measurement-trained FEI or USEF Licensed Official, or veterinarian.
- USEF Measurement Cards will be accepted as proof of height.
- Measurement **MUST** be taken from the highest point of the withers. This spot must be identified by palpation before measurement is taken.
- Animals are to be measured on a flat, hard, level surface. Concrete or Tarmac is ideal. If no such surface is available, the floor of a horse trailer which has been levelled is acceptable.
- The animal must be positioned with front legs parallel and perpendicular. Front toes **SHOULD BE** inline. All four feet must be taking weight. The head must be in its natural upright position.
- Officials may not measure their own or their family's animals.
- A veterinarian is not required to measure unless an animal is borderline in height and there might be a question as to what height it might be.
- Photographic identification, such as a Coggins with photographs is acceptable for animal identification.
- If a Coggins has a space for notes, a veterinarian may measure the animal and add the height in this space.
- All ponies and VSEs may be measured beginning January 1, 2020.
- Effective July 1, 2020, all ponies and VSEs competing in an ADS-recognized event must have a valid ADS Measurement Card or USEF Measurement Card as defined in Art 930.4.

A page dedicated to the ADS VSE & Pony Measurement Program has been created on the ADS website and can be accessed by clicking the button below. On it you will find a list of frequently asked questions, a list of ADS Licensed Officials who have been trained to measure animals (this document will be updated regularly as the list grows), and the ADS VSE & Pony Measurement Card in fillable PDF format.

How it works:



- Arrive at 10 am or before to decorate your carriage and/or horse/pony/mini/mule/burro/children.
- Secure your horse.
- Sign in (& pay your \$30 club dues, if you haven't already.)
- Get your number tags.
- Tie one tag to your cart and one to your basket (or to yourself if you're ground-driving, in which case an apron with a pocket for eggs may be helpful).

11 am Potluck Brunch

- Bring your potluck food to the pavilion.
- Bring your own plates, utensils and drinks.
- Join the brunch and socialize!

1:00 Parade

- Drive your turnout into the arena for the judges.
- After judging, proceed to the starting line (row of cones).

1:15 THE EASTER EGG HUNT!

- **Line up at the starting line (row of cones)**
- **Set your basket down by a cone**

When the whistle blows:

1. Drive out into the field to find an egg. **STOP.**
 2. One helper gets down, picks up one egg, and gets back into the carriage.
 3. Drive back to your basket at the starting line. **STOP.**
 4. One helper gets down, puts the egg in the basket, & gets back into the carriage.
- REPEAT steps 1 thru 4 for each egg.
 - There will be a warning 5 minutes before the hunt ends.



When the whistle blows again:

- Hand in your basket full of eggs at the Pavilion
- If you want, you may continue to collect eggs after turning in your basket, but these won't count towards prizes.
- Secure your horse and come to the pavilion for prizes.

2:30 Awards

- Come to the pavilion for presentation of prizes!
- **Help clean up & thank the organizers and judges.**
 - After the awards are given out, you may help yourself to the leftover eggs for your local livestock or wildlife.

This is the perfect first drive of the season; remind your horse how to **STOP, STAND, and GO!**

- Entries may be any safe cart or carriage hitched to any size equine. No carriage or cart? Line driving is also ok.

- Only one helper from your turnout on the ground at a time
- Walk or trot only, no cantering.
- Judges are here for fun and to help keep us safe. They are volunteers and their word is final. Please thank them.

Have an older horse that needs a different exercise program? Put those dreams of yours on a carriage seat instead of a saddle! You and your horse can learn new ways to enjoy this equine sport.

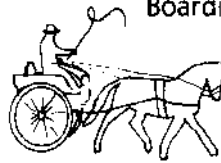
