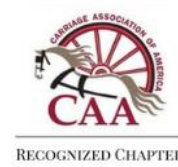

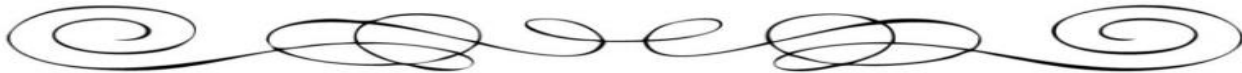

**In tribute to Bob, we reprint here an interview with him that appeared in a 2015 issue of Driving Lines.**

### Colorado Driving Society

Driving Lines interviews long-time club member

**DL:** How did you get started in carriage driving?

**BR:** Well, I just thought it would be a great retirement hobby. I had ridden horses some with friends but I'd never driven. I had watched some driving events and decided I wanted to learn to drive a pair.

**DL:** Had you always had horses?

**BR:** No, but I grew up in New Hampton, Iowa where my dad was a large animal vet, so I'd been around horses.

**DL:** What brought you to Colorado?

**BR:** I first came to Colorado to attend Law School at the University of Denver. After law school, I joined the Air Force and worked as a Judge Advocate General. You've heard the term JAG on TV, right? I was a JAG. Then, after I retired from the Air Force, I worked at the Colorado Attorney General's office 'til I retired the second time and wanted to stay here in Colorado.

**DL:** Did you have a place to keep horses?

**BR:** We had a five-acre place at Keene Ranch, between Castle Rock and Larkspur, so I built a barn and worked with a trainer to find my horses. I was 67 when I got my first horses. They were Morgan-Friesian crosses, Nattie and Miki. They were broke to drive, but pretty green. They weren't real big, about 14.3hh and 15.1hh.

**DL:** Who were your mentors along the way?

**BR:** Jonene Stone and Vickroy were two of the trainers who helped me learn to drive.

**DL:** What kind of carriage did you drive?

**BR:** I had a Meadowbrook, and later a wooden KG two-wheel easy entry shown in the photo, and a 4-wheel runabout for competition.

**DL:** What were some of your first events?

**BR:** I think my first CDE was the 2001 20-Mile House CDE at Salisbury Horse Park. It was a lot of fun and I did pretty well!

Then in 2002, CDS had a nationally sanctioned two-day CDE at High Prairie Farms. There were carriages from all over, and I drove in that.

**DL:** Any particularly memorable things that happened over your 15 years of driving?

**BR:** Well, I had a couple of wrecks. One time, I had new driving lines, which I had oiled. I was in the big arena at Salisbury driving the pair and I lost the reins! We didn't actually wreck, but the horses were going full blast about 6 times around before they finally stopped with the reins wrapped around the axle.

The worst wreck was at home. We had just returned after a very nice drive on a beautiful day and I forgot that my truck and trailer were parked in front of the barn. Somehow, the two offside wheels of the carriage went up over the fender of my truck, causing the carriage to tip over and toss me out. The horses kept going 'til they got to the fence. They went down but were able to get up when I got there to untangle them. I was ok but Nattie never got over that one. She was really shaken. And the truck needed major work!

**DL:** What did you learn from these experiences?

**BR:** Never leave the carriage unless you're tossed out!

**DL:** How were you involved in the Colorado Driving Society?

**BR:** I was treasurer for a few years, and then I was on the board for two terms. I started hosting the Drive at Greenland Open Space a couple times a year. It's pretty close to our place, which is nice.

## Colorado Driving Society at Expo 2018

March 2018 brought an opportunity for CDS to garner a new presence at a venue familiar to most local horse owners, the Rocky Mountain Horse Expo. This annual event brings together a diverse collection of equine interests for a three-day trade fair centered on horses and all things related to the horse lifestyles. Each year the Expo features talent, expertise and professionalism from selected presenters, clinicians, vendors, artists, crafters, and of course horse owners and breeders.

Traditionally, CDS has been allotted a large space in the southwest corner of the Hall of Education, in which we have hosted an exhibit of carriages loaned by club members and staffed a table with club and general driving information. While this has been well received, it has often been passed by or overlooked due to its out-of-the-way location.



This year, following up on suggestions received from Pat Lamprey to make our “booth” more interactive and informative, I became point person to make these ideas for a greater driving presence at Expo, a reality. I agreed with Pat’s vision and strongly believed that getting the Colorado Driving Society onto the published Expo schedule, would bring greater attention to the under-represented driving segment of Colorado’s horse industry. Due to my idleness, Susie Haszelbart assigned this task to me. While I was the driver of this effort, it would not have been accomplished without past president, Fred Wehrli, providing diplomatic liaison with Bill Scubbi, executive director of the Colorado Horse Council (COHOCO) that organizes the Rocky Mountain Horse Expo.

The old adage, “be careful what you ask for,” became a reality for me. I asked Fred if he could intercede on our behalf in an effort to get a timeslot for CDS to give a Driving presentation and get it on Expo’s schedule of events. The next day Fred called me back and said we could have 4 time slots for presentations each day, but that this was contingent upon CDS providing COHOCO with title, day, time and synopsis for each presentation – right away! The surprise of being allowed multiple time slots for presentations was quickly overtaken by a scramble to plan this opportunity to CDS’s best advantage. The end result for CDS was 5 different driving related presentations, in 11 timeslots, over 3 days – and all listed on the Horse Expo schedule of events!

Here are the presentations we gave:

**Whip Handling – Not a Beating Stick:** Learn how this driving aid takes the place of your leg aids and practice with a target.

**Harness a Horse:** Simple steps to de-construct that pile of straps, and dress your horse for a new job.

**Like a Marriage – Horse & Carriage:** How to connect the all those straps to hitch your horse safely and correctly to a cart/carriage.

**Mini-Horse Driving Demo:** Tips and tricks to put your lawn-ornament to work for you.

**Derby Driving Demo:** An exciting new driving sport, combining speed and precision.

The harnessing and hitching presentations were made possible by the sponsorship of Harley D. Troyer Harness and Equipment, Inc., who provided a full-size plastic horse, outfitted with a new biothane breast collar harness. (Mr. Troyer also provided harness catalogs that conveniently contained full diagrams on how to measure a horse for a harness.) The Box-G black and yellow buggy was our hitching demonstration vehicle and also allowed those interested to climb into the driver's seat and get a real perspective on driving a hitched vehicle and handling reins and whip. The driving presentations were done by Phantom Dragon Ranch's miniature horse, Mr. Truck. Mr. Truck also spent time being driven around the tradeshow floor in his Build-a-Bear tennis shoes, with CDS's name and logo on the cart, encouraging people to visit our exhibit and attend a presentation. He was a great attention getter just hanging out in the booth area, which this year had an unprecedented number of visitors asking general questions about driving and the Colorado Driving Society and specifics about horses, harnesses and carriages.

One of the best visitor draws of 2018's CDS Expo booth was Sunday's free drawing for a new, miniature horse, biothane harness that was generously donated by Harley D. Troyer Harness and Equipment, Inc. The give-away harness was prominently displayed on Troyer's plastic, mini-sized horse foal and properly hitched to a mini-cart. Throughout Expo, attendees that stopped to fill out cards to drop in the jar also took time to view carriages, visit with our volunteers, and pick up CDS flyers with membership forms and Troyer Harness catalogs.

In addition to the exhibit of member's carriages as in years past, another highlight of CDS's expanded Expo presence was a special exhibit area for "Entry Level Vehicles," and a sample hazard set up. The entry level display showcased vehicles for miniature horses, ponies, standard-sized horses and drafts. Each of these vehicles displayed: its price range; new or used purchase; type of animal driven; a description of where/when used by the owner; and an in-use action photo. It was surprising how many visitors lingered and discussed vehicles and driving, with many commenting that they had not known that getting a vehicle to start their horses could be that affordable. Also in this area, we set up a sample marathon style hazard provided by Pat Lamprey. People could try walking through it, then pulling a pony cart through it, and finally pulling the cart through with a "driver" in it.

I would like to give thanks to the many members and member's friends that made this year's Expo such a success for the Colorado Driving Society: Fred Wehrli, Pat Lamprey, Susie Haszelbart, Eric and Kristina Jensen, Frieda & Derick Moore, Gary Lewman, Sandy Clayton, Paula Moffett, Joe Johnson, Linda Holloway, Sunny Weeks, Amanda Miller with daughter Orrill and Mr. Truck, and Harley Troyer.

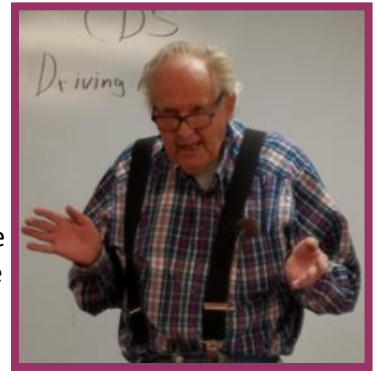

## The March 24th Driving 101 Clinic was well-received with a great turnout

Thirteen people pre-registered for the seminar, and two more registered at the door.

Basic personal protection and safety were the first items covered, followed by proper attire to be worn while driving carriages. A brief overview of the proper whip length, balance and holding the whip was followed by a demonstration of these items. An arena outline was presented and discussion followed about where to turn and the advisability of varying the direction of turn each time you enter the arena. The importance of arena safety was emphasized and the desirability of having an assistant aid you while preparing the horse and carriage for arena entry.



Identifying pitfalls, you can encounter, when acquiring the necessary harness was addressed. Discussion then proceeded to the various parts of a carriage harness and their function. A brief discussion about draft harness and the differences, including weight, from carriage harness, was held. Mention was made regarding the different colors of lines on a carriage harness. We addressed the thoughts you should use while working with a horse and the minimum maintenance check list after you have "put to" on both sides of your turnout.



Bridles and bits and their different appearances, functions and names were examined, and the importance of them being correct for the horse was emphasized.

Next a discussion was held regarding the carriage, its parts, maintenance and the importance of examining the carriage prior to each use. The importance of bringing the shafts down over the horses back was emphasized. Nuances of certain carriages was discussed, to emphasize their benefit to the horse.

The carriage harness, and its many variations, and carriage differences and the way you "put to" was emphasized again, with the variations of a driving bridle were emphasized with the variations in driving bits.

A discussion of the various hand/line/whip positions and their advantages/disadvantages were followed by a "hands on" demonstration using a rein board as a practice tool. Several participants tried their hand, with their recently acquired knowledge.

An emphasis was placed on suitable gaits in the arena, followed by some of the games/classes that each student could practice at their leisure.

A brief discussion of the importance of slowly, and consistently, starting a horse, in whatever discipline you choose was followed by emphasizing that you choose a breed, and a horse, that matches you and your chosen discipline.

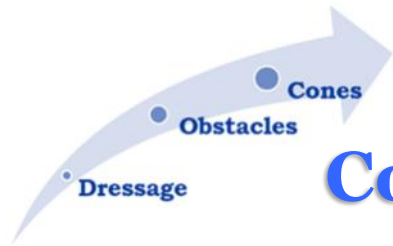

## *What is Combined Driving?*

CDEs (combined driving events) are modeled after the ridden sport of three-day eventing. There are three phases in CDEs, and the object is to get the lowest number of penalty points over the three days.

Any size, type or breed of horse (or mule!) – from miniatures to drafts – can compete in CDEs in divisions by equine size (mini, pony, horse, etc.) and number (singles, pairs, four-in-hands, etc.) Drivers compete against drivers of similar experience level (training, preliminary, advanced.)

Most types of driving vehicles are allowed as well. Single horses may compete in 2- or 4-wheeled vehicles and multiples in 4-wheelers.

The first day is DRESSAGE, the foundation of training which makes success in the other phases possible. The dressage test is a prescribed sequence of movements driven from memory. Each test is judged on the driver's general command of the horse, the horse's impulsion and its regularity of gaits.

MARATHON, on the second day, is a test of stamina, courage, and agility – and is most drivers' favorite phase. All carriages (except those pulled by VSEs) carry 1 or 2 navigators. Competitors travel miles over dirt roads and fields. They negotiate obstacles quickly. Losing points for seconds on course over the allowed time. Obstacles require the driver go through gates in the correct sequence.

The final day of a CDE is the CONES course. Cones

### How it works:

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter horses of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor.

The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

### RULES

#### Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only.
- Open division: any gait.

Classes refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter:

- VSE/Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands) \*very small equine
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

#### Presentation:

- Horses and riders must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style/

#### Navigators:

- All entries except VSE or small pony are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE or small pony.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive single in VSE class.

#### Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be restored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

#### Course:

- A course diagram will be emailed after the closing date and will be available upon check-in.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones will be set at a common width of 175 cm.
- Obstacle gates will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart.
- The entry to each gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction. Entering a gate with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

#### SCORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time. Penalties are listed on page 9.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.
- There will be recognition for the lowest combined scores from Derby I on June 16 and Derby II on Sept 15, 2018.

#### To Enter the Driving Derby.

- Entries and fees must be received no later than May 26, 2018. *Make checks payable to Colorado Driving Society.* A confirmation email will be sent upon receipt of entry.

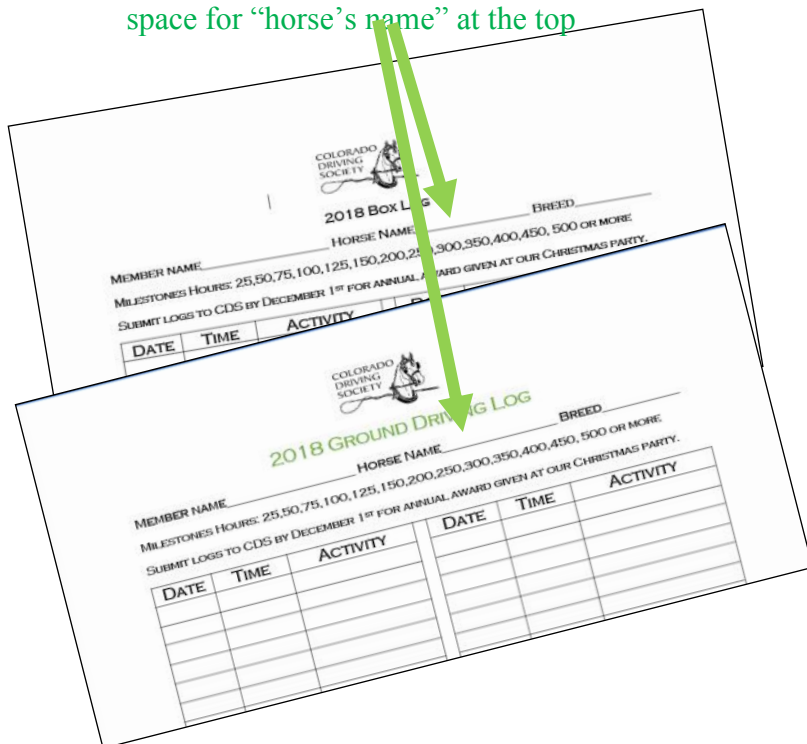

  - Three months before your event, submit a budget to the CDS event coordinator [pat.lamprey@gmail.com](mailto:pat.lamprey@gmail.com). No publicity for an event will be released until your budget has been approved.
  - Once your budget is approved, please submit a description of the event to the newsletter editor.\* Include event title, date, time, location, rain date, fees, organizer, details of the event, closing date for entries & where to send fee & registration. (Please send content with minimal formatting. We'll take care of the layout.)
  - For help recruiting volunteers, contact the volunteer coordinator\* with a list of the positions to be filled (set-up, scribe, timer etc.) two months prior to the event
  - After your event, please send results, photos and a report to the newsletter editor.\*
  - To be reimbursed by the club for an expense you incur, you must provide a receipt and a CDS reimbursement form, available on the CDS website.
- Items that are donated require a receipt for the value of the item and the word "Donated" written on the receipt for tax purposes. This can include a judge's fee if the judge normally charges but chooses to donate the service to CDS.

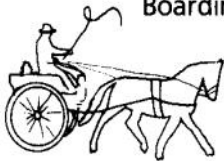

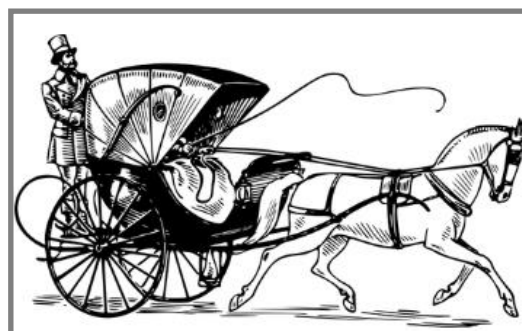
