The organizing committee of the Colorado CDE has reluctantly decided to postpone the 2019 Colorado CDE until 2020.

The 2019 Colorado CDE and Vesicular Stomatitis

After careful consideration of the facts on VSV in Colorado, and in order to protect our competitors and their horses, **the organizing committee of the Colorado CDE has reluctantly decided to postpone the 2019 Colorado CDE until 2020.**

Vesicular stomatitis virus is a reality in the horse world, with outbreaks cycling through the US every 4-10 years. Colorado is being particularly hard hit this year, with the in-state impact continuing to worsen.

While VSV isn't the most threatening disease a horse can face, it is uncomfortable and contagious, causing discomfort and loss of weight and condition, as well as the possibility of laminitis. The virus is spread by flies and other insects, and has a 2-8 day incubation period. This means that a horse could be infected and leave for home before showing symptoms, and therefore infect its home herd.

In addition to the physical impact on infected horses, we are concerned about the inconvenience of competitors' horses being quarantined in Colorado and possible difficulty in returning horses to their home states.

We want to safeguard your horses' health and soundness so they can join us next year for a bigger and better event with improved arenas, exciting new hazards, and marathon and cones routes by international course designer, Richard Nicoll.

We look forward to seeing you in 2020!

How it works:

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter equines of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

RULES

Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only.
- Open Division: any gait.

Classes refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter including mules and donkeys.

- VSE/Under 9.3 hands/39 inches
- Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands)
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

Presentation:

- Horses and riders must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style.

Navigators:

- All entries except VSE or small pony are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry. All hitches of multiples, regardless of size, must have one or more navigators.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE or small pony.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive single in VSE class.

Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be restored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

Course:

- A course diagram will be emailed after the closing date and will be available upon check-in.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones will be set at a common width of 200 cm.
- Obstacle gates will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart.
- The entry to each gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction. Entering a gate with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

SCORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.
- There will be recognition for the lowest combined scores from Derby I on June 29 and Derby II on Sept 21, 2019.

To Enter the Driving Derby.

- Fill out the entry form on the next page.
- Entries and fees must be received no later than September 7, 2019. *Make checks payable to Colorado Driving Society.* A confirmation email will be sent upon receipt of entry.
- If you are under 18, your parent or legal guardian must sign the release on the entry form along with you.
- Drivers and navigators (and parent/guardian when applicable) must sign release on entry form before participating.

As a former L4 EXCA judge she hosted EXCA official events and the AQHA Trail Trials.

Bring your horse, gloves, helmet, whip, harness and carriage, or surcingle and long lines.

Bring a dish to share, a chair, lots of your favorite beverages and sun screen.

We want to prepare our equines for future parades (especially the Parker Christmas parade).

So, for one of the obstacles, participants and volunteers will line up on two sides and act like crazy parade watchers, while each horse and carriage or horse on lead line drives through the obstacle.

We will start at 10 am with horses “on-lead-line.”

We will have a potluck lunch around 1 pm.

After lunch we will do more obstacles. You can choose to go through the obstacles with your horse on a lead line, ground driving, or drive in a carriage.
