2019 Rocky Mountain Horse EXPO

A great place to introduce carriage driving to horse lovers.

Throughout the three-day EXPO, March 1, 2 & 3, visitors toured the display of carriages from CDS and RMCC, and attended Terri Miller's presentations about harnessing and putting a carriage to a horse—a full sized plastic horse on wheels, that is.

Meanwhile, Amanda Miller, her daughter Orrill and one of Amanda's students took turns driving their miniature horses around the vendors' displays in the EXPO Hall, and drove the Derby Obstacle we set up behind the carriage display. (We had an ideal space!)

This attracted more visitors to the carriage display where representatives of both clubs chatted with folks curious about carriage driving, and offered literature about club activities.

Once again, our CDS team stole the show.

On Friday and Saturday evenings, March 1 & 2, the audience at the Event Center Arena got a rare treat. For the "Warm-Up Show" before the Mane Event, CDS members demonstrated a Carriage Driving Derby. First, Susie Haszelbart entered the arena in her carriage driving Shasta, her Haflinger mare, while her Saturday passengers Diane and Kevin Russell unloaded numbers from the back of the carriage and quickly set up an obstacle course.

Soon five different turnouts, in sizes from mini to max, entered one by one to drive the course. In turn, each turnout drove the course two more times before they picked up the numbers and cleared the arena. After a few minutes of darkness, the carriages again entered the arena, this time carrying Mane Event dignitaries, as they were introduced under the spotlights.

1. All classes are at a walk
2. All drivers are required to carry a whip and wear gloves.
3. Drivers and assistants must wear helmets.
4. No lead line will be attached to the bridle or bit, except when the bridle has a gullet strap with a ring for the snap.
5. Halters will be over the bridles.
6. All drivers and assistants will walk the courses prior to commencement of the classes.

How it works:

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter horses of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

RULES

Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only.
- Open division: any gait.

Classes refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter, including mules and donkeys:

- VSE/under 9.3 hands (39 inches) (VSE=very small equine)
- Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands)
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

Presentation:

- Horses and drivers must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style.

Navigators:

- All entries except VSE or small pony are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE or small pony.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive single in VSE class.

Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be restored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

Course:

- A course diagram will be emailed after the closing date and will be available upon check-in.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones will be set at a width of 2 meters.
- Obstacle gates will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart.
- The entry to each gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction. Entering a gate with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

SCORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time. Penalties are listed on the reverse of this page.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.
- There will be recognition for the lowest combined scores from Derby I on June 29 and Derby II on Sept. 21, 2019.

To Enter the Driving Derby.

- Fill out the entry form and mail with proper fees.
- *Make checks payable to Colorado Driving Society.* A confirmation email will be sent upon receipt of entry.
- If you are under 18, your parent or legal guardian must sign the release on the entry form along with you.

2 Course Timers – One is primary and the other is backup in case a stopwatch malfunctions. The Timers stand near the start/finish line and record each competitors time.

2 Hazard Observers – A Hazard Observer records the order the competitors go through the hazard gates, gates A through gate E, and reports any errors to the judge.

2 Cone Setters – They are responsible for resetting any cones or hazard barrels that are upset and balls that become dislodged.

Announcer – Announces competitors in order over the PA system for each round and general announcements during the derby.

This is a morning event and lunch is provided for the volunteers.

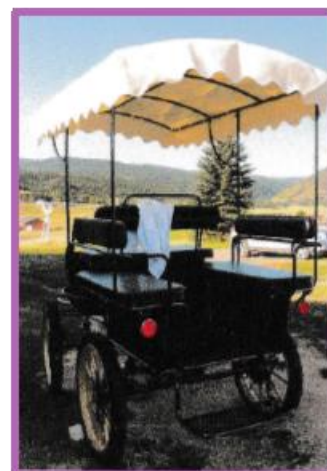
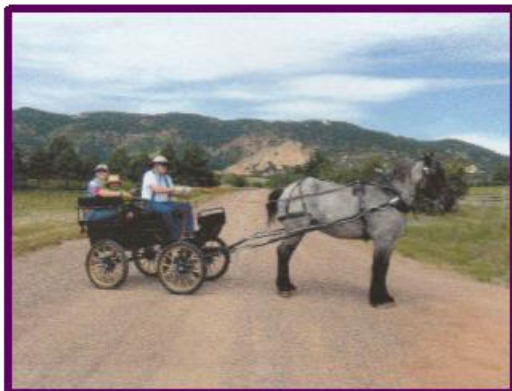

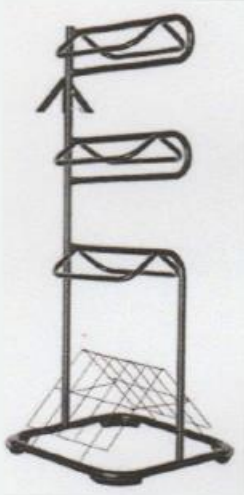
