How it works:

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter equines of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

RULES

Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only.
- Open Division: any gait.

Classes refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter including mules and donkeys.

- VSE/Under 9.3 hands/39 inches
- Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands)
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

Presentation:

- Horses and riders must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style.

Navigators:

- All entries except VSE or small pony are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry. All hitches of multiples, regardless of size, must have one or more navigators.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE or small pony.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive single in VSE class.

Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be restored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

Course:

- A course diagram will be emailed after the closing date and will be available upon check-in.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones will be set at a common width of 200 cm.
- Obstacle gates will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart.
- The entry to each gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction. Entering a gate with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

SCORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.
- There will be recognition for the lowest combined scores from Derby I on June 29 and Derby II on Sept 21, 2019.

To Enter the Driving Derby.

- Fill out the entry form on the next page.
- Entries and fees must be received no later than September 7, 2019. *Make checks payable to Colorado Driving Society.* A confirmation email will be sent upon receipt of entry.
- If you are under 18, your parent or legal guardian must sign the release on the entry form along with you.
- Drivers and navigators (and parent/guardian when applicable) must sign release on entry form before participating.

Bring your horse, gloves, helmet, whip, harness and carriage, or surcingle and long lines.

Bring a dish to share, a chair, lots of your favorite beverages and sun screen.

We want to prepare our equines for future parades especially the Parker Christmas parade.

So, for one of the obstacles, participants and volunteers will line up on two sides and act like crazy parade watchers, while each horse and carriage or horse on lead line passes through the obstacle.

After lunch we will do more obstacles. You can choose to go through the obstacles with your horse on a lead line, ground driving, or drive in a carriage.

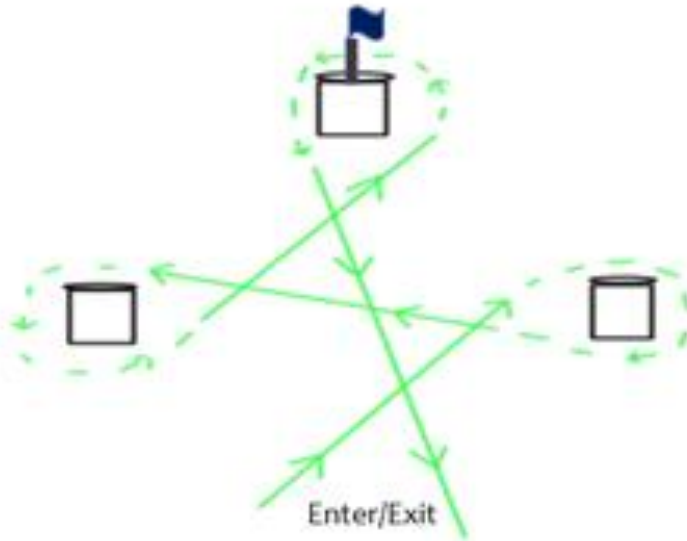

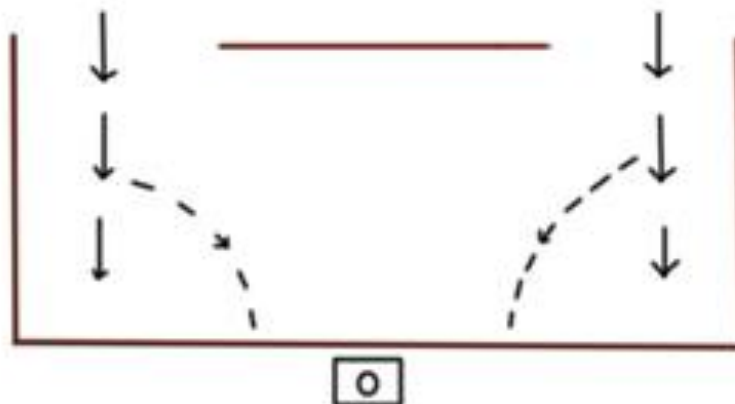
Flag Cloverleaf

3 barrels are placed in a triangle formation. You will drive a standard barrel pattern (cloverleaf) circling to either the right or left to start, and while circling the last barrel you must place the flag in the bucket on the barrel. Fastest time, at either the trot or canter division, while not knocking down any barrels and successfully placing the flag in bucket wins. Knocking a barrel over- 5 second penalty, flag not in bucket - 10 seconds added to time, incorrect cloverleaf pattern is elimination.



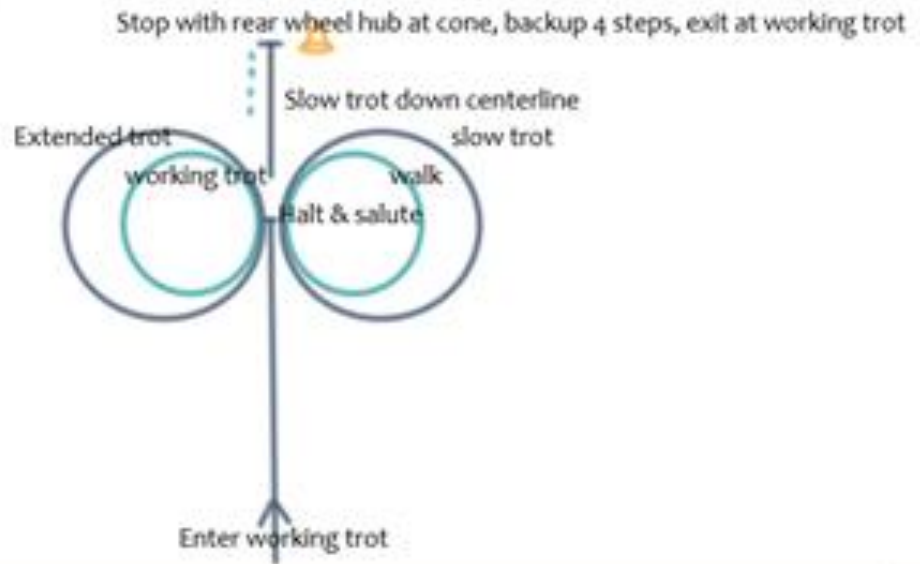
Dock, Deliver, Depart

Remembering the days of wagon deliveries, this event is intended to test your skills of backing, side passing, and quickness. Choose your best side (right or left), back into the shoot (10 points), side pass 90 degrees (10 points), drop off basket (10 points) and depart to exit without knocking any of the boards (5 seconds added for knocking boundary boards out of place). Fastest time and points are calculated to determine the winner.



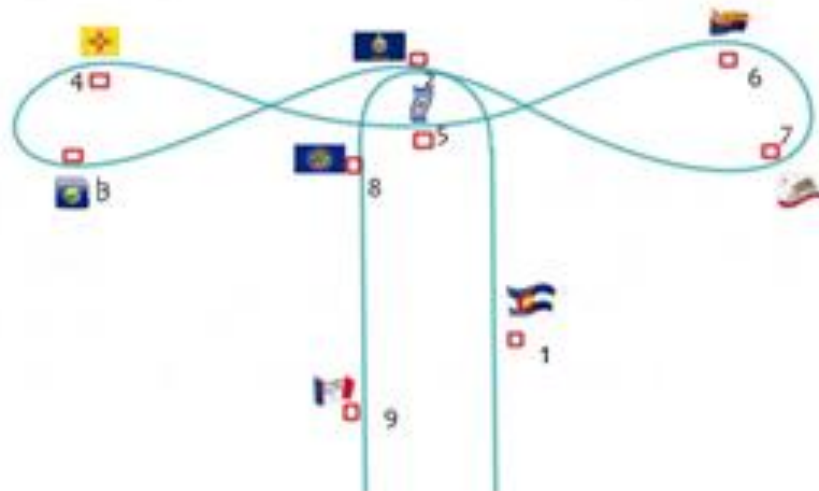
Double OO's

This class will test you reinsmanship skills. Enter the ring at a working trot (10 points), drive to center of circles, halt & salute the judge (10 points). Start the smaller circle on you right at a walk (10 points), followed by a slow trot for the larger circle on the right (10 points). As you finish that large circle, start the small circle on left at a working trot (10 points), then start a large circle on the left at an extended trot (10 points). Once complete, drive down center line at a slow trot (10 points), stop at the cone in line with your rear wheel hub (10 points). Back 4 steps (10 points), then exit at a working trot (10 points). 100 possible points, if not completed correctly, 0 points awarded.



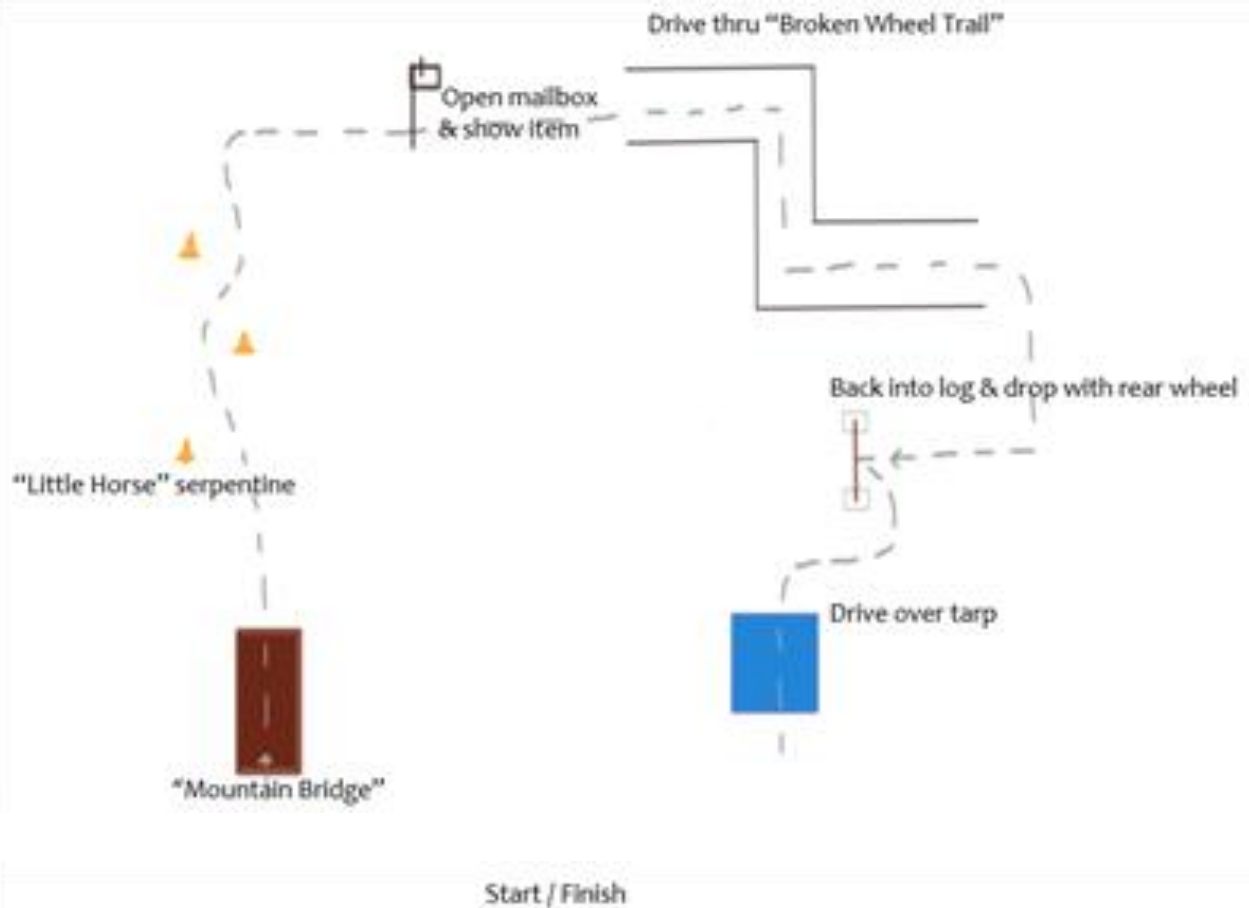
Race through the States

Drive the marked course lined with flags from Colorado, Kansas, Montana, New Mexico, Minnesota, Arizona, California, Nebraska & Iowa. Best time wins, it's colorful & unique!



Over Hill & Dale

Follow the trail over the mountain bridge, through the little horse serpentine, to the mailbox where you'll open & show the item, drive through the broken wheel trail pipe lined path, back up and use your carriage wheels to drop the wooden rail from the cinderblocks, then cross the tarp and head to the finish. Obstacles are worth 30 points each, 10 points are subtracted for each refusal, after 3 refusals, you must move on. Time will be used as the tie breaker.



Final note: Since there are 2 divisions, either **walk/trot** or **trot/canter**, you must keep to those gaits only or you will receive penalty points. The intent is to keep it fun & fair for all. Blue Jeans are the expected attire, so no lap robe is necessary. Helmets are strongly encouraged & required if you're under 18 years old. A groom is required if you're driving multiples. The classes will run concurrently, to minimize any wait time and allow you to continue driving from one game to another. We normally conclude around noon, enjoy lunch together & awards, pack up & head home.
