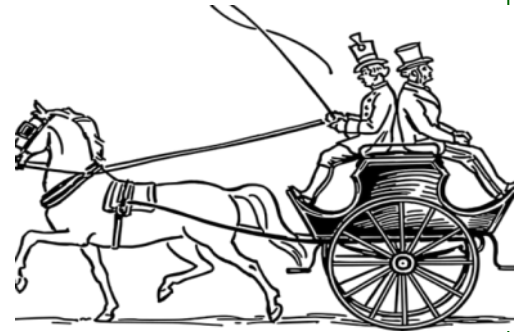

HOW IT WORKS

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter equines of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

RULES

Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only.
- Open Division: any gait.

Classes refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter, including mules and donkeys.

- VSE/Under 9.3 hands/39 inches
- Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands)
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

Presentation:

- Horses and riders must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style.

Navigators:

- All entries except VSE or small pony are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry. Multiple hitches must have a navigator regardless of horse size.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE or small pony.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive without an adult in VSE classes.

Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be re-

stored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

Course:

- A course diagram will be emailed after the closing date and will be available upon check-in.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones will be set at a common width of 200 cm.
- Obstacle gates will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart.
- The entry to each gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction. Entering a gate with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

SCORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.
- There will be recognition for the lowest combined scores from the season's derbies.

TO ENTER THE DERBY

- Fill out the entry form and release form (below).
- Submit entry forms and fees. (See dates above.) *Make checks payable to Colorado Driving Society.* A confirmation email will be sent upon receipt of entry.
- If you are under 18, your parent or legal guardian must sign the release on the entry form along with you.
- Drivers and navigators (parent or guardian for minors) must sign release form before participating.

We hope you will join us on August 14, 2021, for a Picnic Drive up historic Buffalo Creek Rd. Except for a handful of residents, this road is closed to all motor vehicle traffic. We have received special permission for parking and access through normally locked gates. This is a small country road, not a trail. The road has a smooth gravel surface and parallels Buffalo Creek for about 5 miles, winding through the forest and a small part of the Buffalo Creek burn area. From the parking site it is a gentle grade following the creek upstream. There are turn out places along the way if needed. (There will be some mountain bikers on the first ¼ mile. The road is wide enough for safe passing, and these users quickly leave the road in preference of the many singletrack trails that lead from the road up into the forest.)

Directions, from Denver/Lakewood:

- 1) From C470 take US Hwy 285 South, to Pine Junction, (this is about 7 miles past Conifer, and will be the first stop light you come to).
- 2) Left at Pine Junction stoplight, heading south on Pine Valley Road (also known as County Rd. 126), toward Pine.
- 3) Continue on County Rd. 126 for about 7 miles, to the small town of Pine, and continue on to Buffalo Creek, 2 miles further down the road.
- 4) At Buffalo Creek you will pass a church on the right and cross a bridge over the North Fork of the South Platte River.
- 5) Cross the river, slow down and look for Buffalo Creek Rd. (¼ mi.)
- 6) Turn right on Buffalo Creek Road and drive ¼ mi. past the Community building (**18050 S. Buffalo Creek Rd.**), and turn left into the Mountain Bike parking area.
- 7) There will be reserved parking for our horse trailers at the far back end of the parking area, (past the picnic pavilion and by the baseball backstop).

Additional notes:

If you have friends or family that would rather ride, horseback riders/outriders are welcome to join us.

This area is a no cell phone zone. You will lose cell service when you leave Pine Junction.

In spite of what your GPS may direct you, **DO NOT TAKE HWY 67 FROM SEDALIA TO DECKERS!** It is a bad road for horse trailers and will take you twice as long.

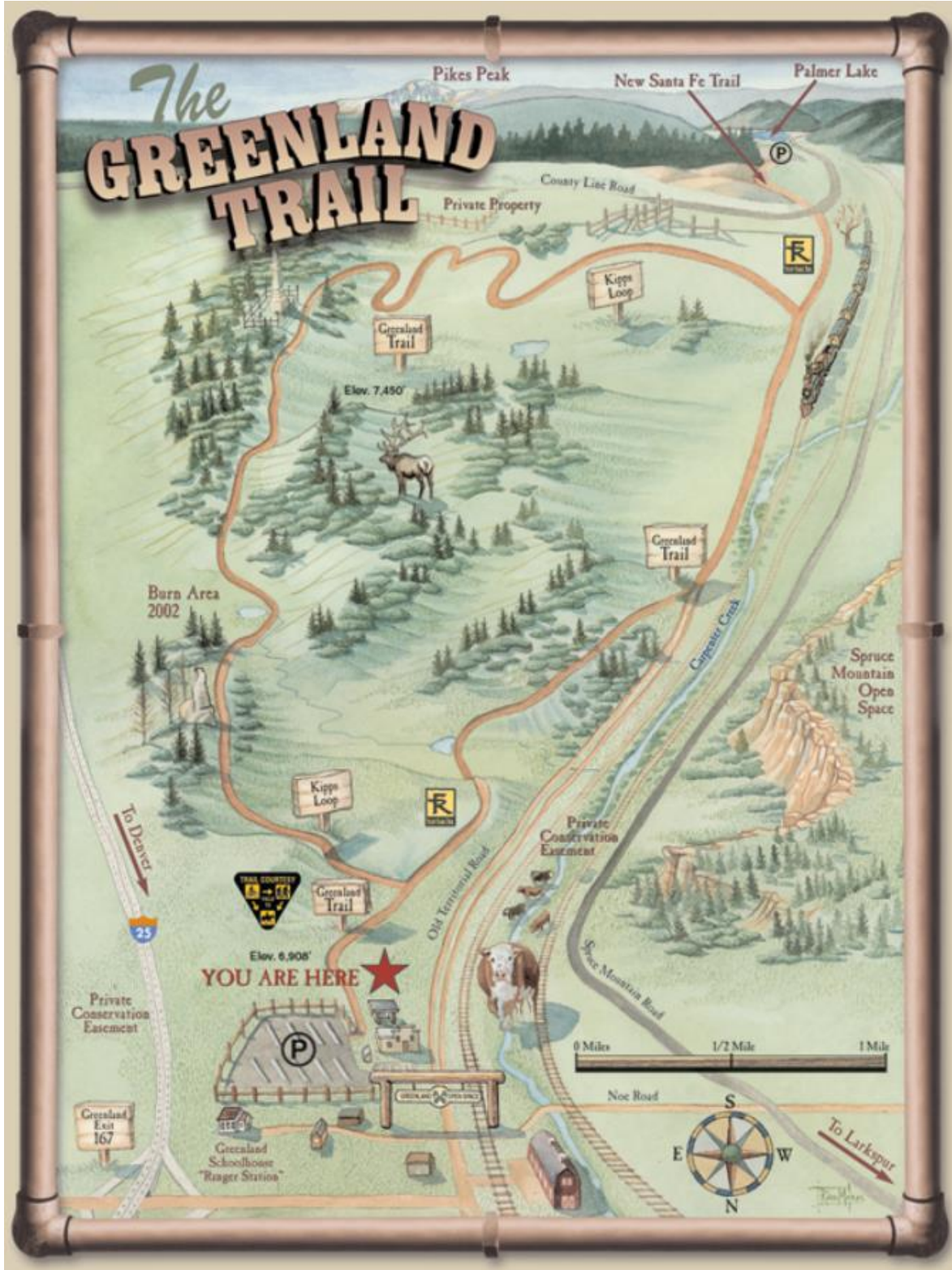

Get more involved with CDS . . .

We're still looking for someone to fill one critical position:

- **Volunteer Coordinator—** Contacts coordinators for the various CDS events to see how many and what kind of volunteers are needed for their events, then contacts club members and others to see who can fill which positions.

Reminders for Event Organizers:

1. Guidelines for organizers, a sample budget, and reimbursement forms are available from the event coordinator (below).
 2. Three months before your event, submit a budget to the CDS board of directors through the event coordinator. *No publicity for an event will be released until the budget has been approved.*
 3. Once your budget is approved, please submit a description of the event to the newsletter editor. Include event title, location, date, time, rain date, fees, organizer, details of the event, closing date for entries & where to send entry form and fee. (Please send content with minimal formatting. We'll take care of the layout.)
 4. For help recruiting volunteers, contact the volunteer coordinator (below) two months prior to the event with a list of the positions to be filled (set-up, scribe, timer, cone setters, volunteer judges, announcer, photographer, etc.)
 5. Arrange for a volunteer to take photographs or contact the newsletter editor about photographs.
 6. After your event, please send a report about scores, awards, number of entries, etc. to the newsletter editor.
 7. To be reimbursed by the club for any expenses you incur, you must provide a receipt and a CDS reimbursement form, available from the event coordinator.
- Items that are donated require a receipt for the value of the item and the word "Donated" written on the receipt for tax purposes. This can include a judge's fee if the judge normally charges but chooses to donate the service to CDS.
