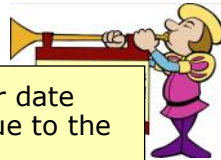

Get more involved with CDS . . .

We’re still looking for people to fill two critical positions:

- **Newsletter Editor**—Collects information, formats it in MS Publisher (help available!), and distributes it through the CDS email distribution list.

Event Organizers . . . If your event is at Salisbury Equestrian Center, consider saving some money by anchoring your event at the east side of the polo field in order to use the permanent porta-potty by the white arena rather than renting a porta-potty (at the cost of \$150).

The American Driving Society, Inc. Announces Pony and VSE Measurement Program

Cross Plains, WI.-The American Driving Society, Inc. (ADS) announced for 2020 its new Pony & VSE Measurement Program. Appendix GR-B and Article 930.4 will be added to the 2020 ADS Rulebook:

1. ADS Ponies are 120cm to 148cm with or without shoes, 149 with shoes.
2. ADS Small Ponies are 99cm to less than 120cm; with or without shoes.
3. VSEs are under 99cm with or without shoes.
4. Animals will be measured prior to their first competition of each year until reaching the competition age of 8 years, after which they will receive a Permanent Card.
5. Measurement Cards are for the exclusive use of ADS Competitions.

Measurement Procedures:

- An ADS Measurement may be taken by only a trained ADS Licensed Official, a measurement-trained FEI or USEF Licensed Official, or veterinarian.
- USEF Measurement Cards will be accepted as proof of height.
- Measurement MUST be taken from the highest point of the withers. This spot must be identified by palpation before measurement is taken.
- Animals are to be measured on a flat, hard, level surface. Concrete or Tarmac is ideal. If no such surface is available, the floor of a horse trailer which has been levelled is acceptable.
- The animal must be positioned with front legs parallel and perpendicular. Front toes SHOULD BE inline. All four feet must be taking weight. The head must be in its natural upright position.
- Officials may not measure their own or their family's animals.
- A veterinarian is not required to measure unless an animal is borderline in height and there might be a question as to what height it might be.
- Photographic identification, such as a Coggins with photographs is acceptable for animal identification.
- If a Coggins has a space for notes, a veterinarian may measure the animal and add the height in this space.
- All ponies and VSEs may be measured beginning January 1, 2020.
- Effective July 1, 2020, all ponies and VSEs competing in an ADS-recognized event must have a valid ADS Measurement Card or USEF Measurement Card as defined in Art 930.4.

Due to COVID-19, the date of effect has been postponed to January 1, 2021.

A page dedicated to the ADS VSE & Pony Measurement Program has been created on the ADS website and can be accessed by clicking the button below. On it you will find a list of frequently asked questions, a list of ADS Licensed Officials who have been trained to measure animals (this document will be updated regularly as the list grows), and the ADS VSE & Pony Measurement Card in fillable PDF format.

Carriage driving is more than just a big draft horse pulling a bunch of sightseers around town. Carriage driving is one of the fastest growing equestrian sports today, and can be as difficult or simple as you choose to make it: a simple picnic drive with friends, a trail "ride" through a park, an exhilarating cross-country marathon, a challenging obstacle course, a dressage test as sophisticated as the highest level of ridden dressage.

You can drive any size horse or pony, from miniature to draft, or drive a mule or donkey instead. Put that lawn ornament or out-grown pony to work! Have an older horse that needs a different exercise program? Put those dreams of yours on a carriage seat instead of a saddle! You and your horse can learn new ways to enjoy this equine sport.

Just as with any other equestrian discipline, it can take years to become a really successful carriage driver, but this clinic can get you started.

This is a clinic for *first time and existing drivers*.

This is a NO HORSES classroom clinic covering basic safety, harness parts, harnessing and biting, carriages, and basic driving styles, and starting the horse.

Students: Please bring your driving gloves and buggy or carriage whip (if you have them).

Lunch break 12:00PM - 1:00PM. Students -- lunch on your own – three restaurants nearby or BYO.

HOW IT WORKS

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter equines of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

RULES

Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only.
- Open Division: any gait.

Classes refer to equine size; any equine breed is permitted, including mules and donkeys.

- VSE/Under 9.3 hands/39 inches
- Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands)
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

Presentation:

- Horses and riders must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style.

Navigators:

- All entries except VSE or small pony are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may drive with more than one entry. Multiple hitches must have a navigator regardless of horse size.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE or small pony.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive without an adult in VSE classes.

Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be re-

stored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

Course

- A course diagram will be emailed after the closing date and will be available upon check-in.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Course width will be set at a common width of 200 cm.
- Obstacle gates will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart. The entry to each gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction. Entering a gate with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is a error and cause for elimination.
- Driving gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Gate completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

CORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.
- There will be recognition for the lowest combined scores from the season's derbies.

TO ENTER THE DERBY

- Fill out the entry form and release form (below).

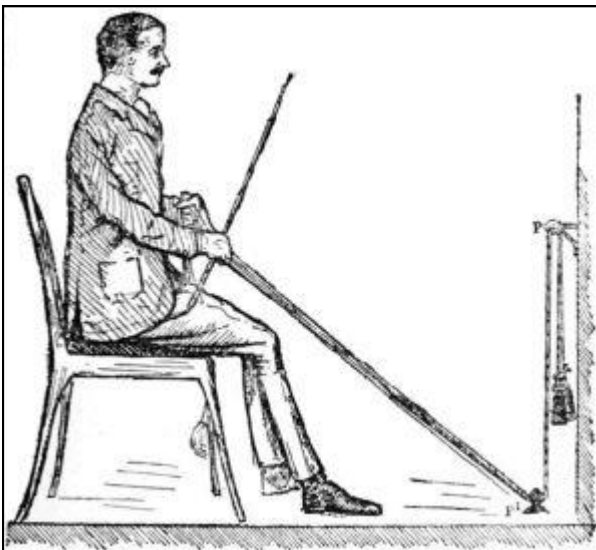

DRIVING IN THE DINING ROOM

Stuck at home due to COVID-19? Don't despair, you can practice carriage driving and whip handling at home!

Driving and sleighing are incredibly fun and rewarding activities, sadly not everyone is able to indulge on a daily basis. Rein boards are a very viable option for practicing but if you board your horse and/or have a smaller living area there may not be space to keep a rein board. Are there other alternatives? Of course!



Practicing Driving With The Weights as described in *Hints on Driving* by Captain C. Morley Knight.

The late Major Faudel-Philips urged his students to practice using a chair. Using an upright chair on carpet (or a rug), attach the lines to the top of the back of the chair. Sit in another chair facing it and, with the lines held correctly, gradually pull back until the chair balances on two legs. Practice holding steady tension by not allowing the chair to become unbalanced, by relaxing and tightening the hand the chair can 'have its head' and then collect back up again.

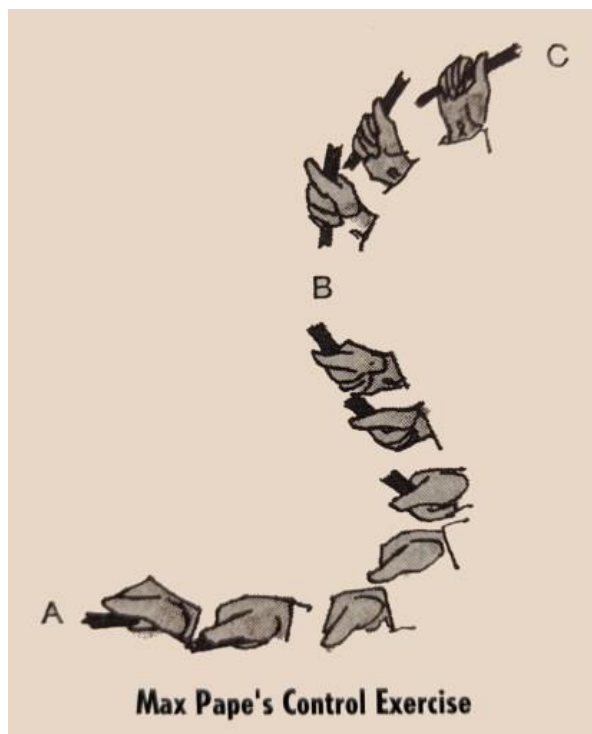
Several years ago, a driving club did something similar but combined the aspects of a rein board with Major Faudel-Philips' chair exercise. The chairs had horizontal slats in the back, allowing the lines to slide through without issue. Light weights, in the form of water bottles, were attached (like a with a rein board) and a 'driver' was seated in another chair while a video from the driver's viewpoint was played. The only issue we had was that the rein chair wanted to move but that was easily fixed with a bit of weight in the chair. Chair driving can be easily done at home in conjunction with your favorite driving video. It can be a bit addictive; my fingers still twitch out commands when watching my favorite sleighing video.

If you're interested in going high tech, you may want to try chair driving with a VR headset on. Sadly, there are not many good virtual reality carriage driving videos available yet but there are some exciting harness racing ones. If you have the opportunity to try the virtual harness racing setup that has been visiting equine trade shows it is quite fun, especially when you turn your head and there is a horse's nose nearly on your shoulder as a competitor battles to pass you!

Back at home you can also practice whip control. A well-balanced whip can make holding a whip for a length of time easier but as with all things, practices makes whip holding and handling easier. Practice shortening and lengthening your reins while holding the whip steady during chair driving. Having trouble touching your equine quietly with the whip? Measure your horse/pony to determine the distance from the driver's seat to where you want the whip to touch (shoulder, barrel, etc.). Set up a rectangular table and suitable chair. Take the measurements from your equine and mark the table accordingly with a bit of tape. An empty plastic cup (or other unbreakable item) is placed where the tape is. Practice touching the cup without knocking it over. A fun game can be moving a cup and down the length of the table without knocking it over. You're looking for whip control with this game.

In *The Art of Driving* by Max Pape control is a much talked about topic. In regard to a four-in-hand whip he advocated for practicing, every day for three months, to begin mastering the art. His prescribed exercise for catching the thong of a four-in-hand whip doesn't even involve holding a whip. "Draw a large 'S', about 60-70 cm high, on a wall. Then try to trace the 'S' with the tip of the right-hand thumb in reverse i.e. from the bottom to the top. Start with the thumb at 'A' then go very slowly, slightly downwards, to the right, then up to 'B'. From then on move the thumb upwards to 'C', and remain there for a few seconds." Repeat for ten minutes every day. Eventually close your eyes and rely just on muscle memory.

Here is the thing though, we put a lot of time, effort and money into training even the most basic driving horse. Shouldn't we also put some effort into making ourselves smoother drivers? We all want wonderful driving experiences so play games, knock a few plastic cups over, laugh as you completely miss the turn in a virtual hazard, just enjoy your time as a driving room driver. When it is time for the real thing, go out there and have a great drive!

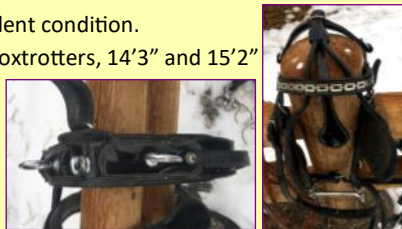
