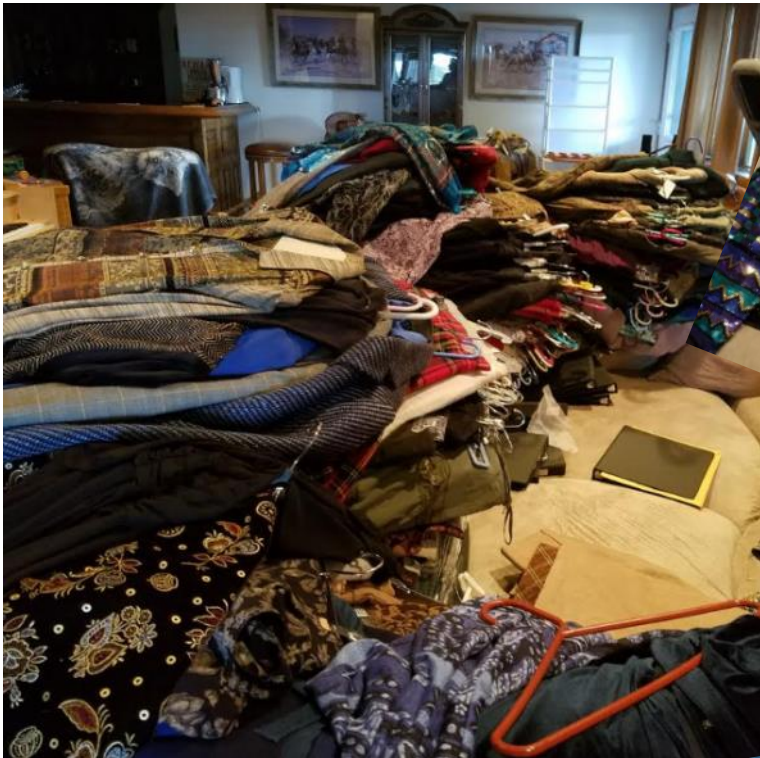

## Obstacle Driving Classes

See Rules and Regulations on the following pages.

### Driven Trail

1. WALK through the large L-shape.
2. TROT circle to the left around the box & continue to trot to the U-shape.
3. Back into U-shape until cart wheel touches log. Proceed out at TROT.
4. WALK to mailbox & open box & show item inside.
5. WALK & drive the right wheel between lines.

Finish: Exit at the WALK after driving between the lines.

### Timed Obstacle

**To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles.**

**After passing the starting line, the driver proceeds through each obstacle in order, to the designed finish line.**

**Course faults are assessed as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis.**

### Gambler's Choice

To be driven over a course of unnumbered obstacles, each carrying a specific point value, assigned according to its degree of difficulty. Each driver has the same allowed time to negotiate as many of the obstacles as possible, and try to amass as high a score as possible within that time allowed. After passing through the Start markers, the driver may drive through the obstacles, in any order and direction. Each obstacle may be driven twice, but not in succession. If driven a third time, no points are awarded. No obstacle may be redriven once it has been disturbed, except obstacles meant to be knocked down. No points are given for an incorrectly driven obstacle, but if incorrectly driven and

not disturbed, it may be attempted again. A signal sounds at the end of the allowed time, and the driver must then exit through the finish markers where the total time on course will be recorded. If already committed to an obstacle when the signal sounds, the driver may complete the obstacle and receive the points, then proceed to the finish. It is up to the judge to decide if the competitor was committed at the signal. Placings are determined by the greatest number of points accumulated in the least time. Obstacle may include a bridge, mail box to be opened, flag carried, 360 degree circle, parallel poles, various cones pairs in figures, back up knock down, and others.

### Town & Country

After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line. Obstacles are set at 80 inches (2.0m) for all competitors. At least 30% of the obstacles must not be a pair of cones, but instead an obstacle that could be encountered while out driving through

town or country; i.e., mailbox and cones, trash barrel and cone, flagpole and a cone, fence section and cone, bridge, poles set like guardrails, wood piles, artificial animals (these should be set at a distance from a pair of cones to avoid frightening animals).

### Scurry Obstacle

- a. To be driven over a course of unnumbered obstacles consisting of cones and balls, not to exceed 10 obstacles
- b. After passing through the start markers from any direction, the driver proceeds through each obstacle from any direction, in any order. Each obstacle must be driven once. Upon completion of the course, the driver must pass through the Finish markers from any direction where time will be taken.
- c. Refusals and run-outs will not be penalized.
- d. Course faults will be scored as penalty seconds and added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings will be determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first place will be broken by a drive-off, unless otherwise stated in the Omnibus.

**Penalties**

Unless otherwise specified, the penalties shown at right will apply to all Time and Specialty Obstacle classes. Additional penalties will apply as specified in individual class rules

**Timed Competitions**

To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line. Course faults are assessed as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis.

**Rules and Regulations**

All classes offered will be conducted and judged in accordance with The American Driving Society rules and regulations, as much as possible and within reason.

Neither the management of the event nor the property owners of any property used during the event accept any responsibility for accidents, damage, injury or illness to the horses, owners, riders, driver, employees, attendants, spectators or any other person or property in connection with this event.

**Driving Apparel:**

In all classes the driver and any passengers should wear blue jeans and a hat (helmets are strongly encouraged). Drivers must wear gloves. Aprons and/or lap rugs are not required. An appropriate driving whip shall be carried at all times when driving. The whip thong must be able to reach the farthest horse/pony. In all classes drivers and passengers should be dressed neatly and appropriately for the class entered. Blue jeans (blue jeans skirts are acceptable for ladies). Junior drivers (under age 18) must wear an appropriate helmet at all times when driving.

**NO CANTERING ALLOWED**

**Cantering Rule:** Canter is prohibited in all classes. Breaks to canter are defined as three full strides. Canter will be penalized according to class specifications. In the case of multiples, all horses must break to incur penalties.

**Junior Drivers/Passengers**

Drivers under the age of 14, except those driving VSE/miniature horses, must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman at all times.

Drivers or passengers under the age of 18 must wear a suitable helmet at all times when in the vehicle.

**Qualifications**

- VSE: Under 9.3hh
- Small pony: Over 9.3hh, not to exceed 12.2hh
- Large Pony: Over 12.2hh, not to exceed 14.2hh
- Horse: Over 14.2hh
- Multiples are sized based on their tallest member.

The pleasure driving horse may be any breed, color or size. Donkeys and mules of any size are welcomed and will be placed in classes based on their size as defined above.

#### **Vehicle and Harness Requirements:**

Any safe two- or four-wheeled vehicle is appropriate for this competition with the following exceptions:

Wire Wheel Vehicles (i.e. bicycle wheels) are allowed for VSE and Small Ponies only.

Vehicles may have iron or solid rubber tires or inflatable rubber tires.

Any type of harness is acceptable as long as it is safe and appropriate for the turnout. All harness should be clean and in good working order. Breaching is required for any vehicle without working brakes.

Check reins are not allowed in any of the classes.

Kicking or bucking straps are acceptable on all single turnouts.

#### **Turnout Definitions and Groom Requirements:**

**Grooms/Passengers:** must be at least 12 years of age. Grooms may be "recruited" from the volunteer pool if needed.

**Single:** one horse driving a 2- or 4-wheeled vehicle (groom optional)

**Pair:** two horses harnessed abreast driving a 2- or 4-wheeled vehicle (1 groom required)

**Tandem:** two horses harnessed in single file driving a 2- or 4-wheeled vehicle (1 groom required, except for VSE)

**Unicom:** three horses harnessed one in front and two behind driving a 4-wheeled vehicle (2 grooms required, 1 groom for VSE)

**Four-in-hand:** four horses harnessed in pairs, two in front, two behind, driving a 4-wheeled vehicle (2 grooms required)

**Splitting/Combining Classes:** Class sections will be generally defined by the size and number of horses in each turnout as described above in Qualifications and Turnout Definitions. The Judge and/or Show Management reserve the right to split any class section, in the interest of safety, should the number of entries warrant such action. Class sections shall not be less than 3 turnouts. In the event that a class section does not fill, Management reserves the right to combine turnouts in any practical manner. Final class section designations will be provided on the day of the show. Junior drivers will be combined into their own class sections regardless of the size or type of the turnout.

#### **Awards & Divisions**

Ribbons will be awarded 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> place. Champions from each division, based on accumulated points, will receive a high point award. Divisions are VSE, Pony/Donkey, and Horse/Draft/Mule.

#### **BRIDLE RULE**

A bridle with reins attached and passed through the saddle terrets must be in place whenever a horse is hitched to a vehicle. **FAILURE TO COMPLY WILL INCUR ELIMINATION FROM THE EVENT**

#### **Dogs**

Dogs must be on leash at all times.

#### **Other Rules**

Salisbury Park may have other rules posted that the participants are responsible for reading and following.

#### **Lunch**

Please choose your sandwich & cookie in the space provided on the entry form on the entry form; lunch includes chips, and an apple. Water & sodas will be available for everyone.

In an effort to thank our volunteers, would you be so kind as to sponsor a volunteer for lunch? See entry form..

#### **Restroom facilities and water**

There are several restroom facilities available on site.

Water for your horses is available at the maintenance building. This is a good distance from the event site, so it is recommended that you either bring your own water or stop on your way in to the event to pick some up.

#### **Parking**

There is sufficient parking available. Please keep a fair distance between trailers.

#### **The Timing Plan**

In an effort to be efficient with your time, we are planning to run the arena classes and polo field classes simultaneously. This should help shorten the day and keep you driving from the time you put to/hitch until lunch.

## Colorado Driving Society Driving Derby II

### How it works:

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter horses of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

### RULES

#### Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only.
- Open division: any gait.

Classes refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter, including mules and donkeys:

- VSE/under 9.3 hands (39 inches) (VSE=very small equine)
- Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands)
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

#### Presentation:

- Horses and drivers must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style.

#### Navigators:

- All entries except VSE or small pony are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE or small pony.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive single in VSE class.

#### Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured. Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a driver without a groom, the whip may be restored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

#### Course:

- A course diagram will be emailed after the closing date and will be available upon check-in.
- Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones will be set at a width of 200 centimeters.
- Obstacle gates will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart.
- The entry to each gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction. Entering a gate with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

#### SCORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time. Penalties are listed on the page after the entry form.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.
- **The driver with the lowest combined scores from June 16 Derby I and Sept. 15 Derby II will be recognized.**

#### To Enter the Driving Derby.

- Fill out the entry form on the next page.
- Entries and fees must be received no later than May 26, 2018. *Make checks payable to Colorado Driving Society.* A confirmation email will be sent upon receipt of entry.
- If you are under 18, your parent or legal guardian must sign the release on the entry form along with you.
- Drivers and navigators (and parent/guardian when applicable) must sign release on entry form before participating.

The Colorado CDE presents a great opportunity for our driving community to come together and build this exciting and fun event in our state. An enormous amount of planning and organizing has already been accomplished to secure the facility, officials, ADS recognition and much more described below. Two months remain before the event, and we need *all hands on the reins* to bring us across the finish line.

We encourage Colorado drivers to enter – see the omnibus and entry form in this newsletter issue. And we need your additional ideas.

Entries: There is tremendous interest from competitors in CO, MT, AZ, NV, CA, TX, OR, NE, UT, NM, IA, MO, WY, & FL. A number of early entries have been received and we expect the bulk of the entries to arrive in August. The closing date for entries is August 24.

**KNOW THE RULES!**



Did you know that the rule for your groom to be able to provide assistance when driving a cones course has changed for **2018**?

That's right! Your groom can now speak and help you while driving cones during a Combined Driving Event. If you visit the 2018 ADS Rulebook you will see the following changes.

Under penalties the following statement is redlined (Red Text used to indicate statement redlined) and removed from the 2018 rulebook –

**975.2.7** Grooms must be seated in their proper places between the start and finish lines. **They are not allowed to indicate the course or to speak unless they are dismounted.**

Under **ARTICLE 981 Summary of Penalties in Cones** you will also see that the following has been removed from the penalty summary table.

**If a Groom speaks to or indicates the course to the Athlete in any way 975.2 10 penalties 10 seconds**

So, if driving cones with a groom “on board” they can provide verbal assistance to you. Illegal outside assistance from anyone not on the carriage still incurs a penalty of elimination.

Additional Rule Change Information submitted by Pat Lamprey —

ADS rule Book, **Article 945.2 Prohibited outside assistance**

At ADS-recognized events, no person, either on or off a competing carriage entry may give verbal or physical directions to an Athlete **with the exception of persons on the carriage during Marathon and Cones competitions**. Athletes receiving verbal or physical assistance except for permitted outside assistance as listed in **943.2** shall be eliminated at the sole discretion of the Ground Jury.

Whether you're just getting your horse going on the ground (ground driving, or long lining,) or you are "Driving On the Box," (in a cart, carriage or wagon,) log your hours.

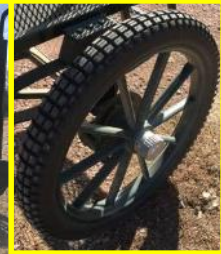

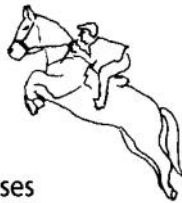

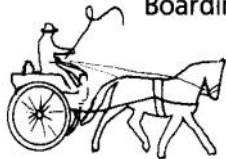
